Article 1、The purpose of this Credit Program is to cultivate the foundation of astronomy professionals for future engagement in related educational and research work.

Article 2、Students from all departments of our university are allowed to take this course.

Article 3、Students who have obtained the required credits in accordance with this regulation will have "Completed Astronomy Credit Program" noted on their graduation transcripts and will be awarded a certificate for the credit program.

Article 4、The Astronomy Credit Program are 12 compulsory credits and 12 elective credits
